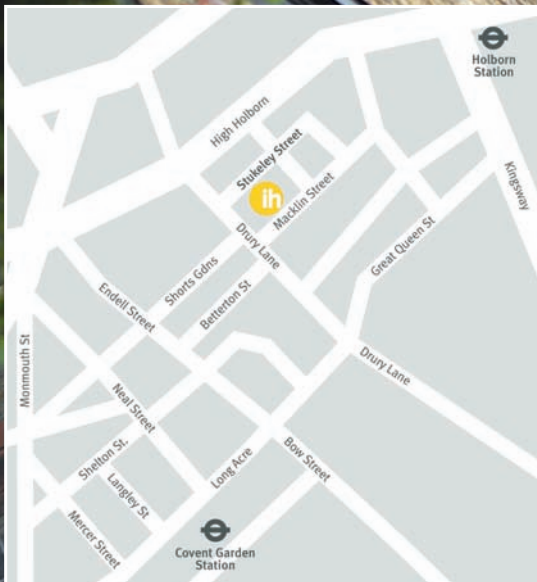

Student Visas:

All non-EU students must have a student visa or one which allows part-time study; in order to attend classes. Please note that if you have a working visa (Tier 1 or Tier 2) for the UK, you are also allowed to study. If you are not sure if your visa allows you to study, please consult the UKBA website.

Student Visitor Visa (SVV)

If you are applying from outside the UK, we will provide the necessary documentation to apply for a Student Visitor visa.

General Student Visa (GSV)

Evening courses do not fulfil the requirements for a General Student Visa (Tier 4) and can only be taken as supplementary study if you already have a GSV from another sponsor.



Minimum age

The minimum age for courses is 16 years old (21 years old for Business Communication).

Payment

Your application will not be processed without payment or valid proof of payment. Please note that if your company is sponsoring your course we require a letter of confirmation from your company.

Refunds & Cancellations
