Who should take this course?

This is an introductory course for people with little or no previous English language teaching experience, or little previous training. Whether you're a recent graduate or looking for a career change, the course will give you the skills and confidence to teach English to adults.

The Cambridge ESOL CELTA (Certificate in English Language Teaching to Adults) is highly regarded throughout the world and has been accredited at level 5 on the National Qualifications Framework.



What does the course involve?

CELTA is available as a 4-week full-time course, or 12-week part-time course. It will help you understand the principles of effective teaching, while acquiring practical teaching skills. The course includes:

- Daily teaching practice in small groups of no more than six
- Practical experience teaching students at different language levels
- Detailed feedback and discussion sessions with tutors
- Observation of qualified teachers
- Guided observation of filmed lessons
- Seminars and demonstrations to improve your language awareness
- Classroom management and lesson planning

There is no final exam: assessment is based on teaching practice and written assignments. You need to pass both elements to be awarded the CELTA certificate.

There is a substantial amount of work outside of time-tabled hours. This will mostly consist of lesson preparation and written assignments.

- You must have the potential to become an effective teacher, and to complete assignments and assessments

Acceptance onto the course is conditional upon completion of an application form (which includes a Language Awareness Task) and a satisfactory interview.





Who are these courses for?

- The **IH Certificate** is for non-native English speakers who would like to teach English as a foreign language. (You must be competent in English to Cambridge Advanced (CAE) level or C1 of the Common European Framework)
- The **IH CLTA** is for people who are native speakers (or native-speaker standard) in the language they want to teach: French, German, Italian or Spanish

What does the course involve?

Both the IH Certificate and the IH CLTA can be studied full-time or part-time. You will learn practical skills to plan and deliver engaging and dynamic lessons. Course features include:

- Regular, small group teaching practice

- Observation of qualified teachers

Our Cambridge Delta is accredited by the Qualifications and Curriculum Authority (QCA) at level 7 on the National Qualifications Framework.

The Delta qualification is a balance of theory and practice to enhance your understanding of the English Language, while examining in-depth the principles of effective teaching and the practical skills required for teaching English. The course comprises three modules detailed below.

Who should take this course?

Delta is for experienced English language teachers who would like to improve their existing skills and develop new techniques for career progression. The qualification is a fast-track to professional recognition and can open up opportunities in teacher training, school management and ELT publishing.



Flexibility to take individual modules

Because the Delta is modular, you can also take individual modules as stand-alone courses. Each module is separately certificated by Cambridge and can be taken in any order. For example, if you already have a Delta qualification but want additional specialist certification then apply for Module 3. Or, if you have a Masters in ELT/ESOL/Applied Linguistics but want more practical experience then apply for Module 2. The table below will help you decide which module(s) is appropriate for you.

The course lasts 12 weeks and consists of three units, each of which lasts four weeks. Participants are expected to study and participate in online tasks for up to 5 hours per week. Module one looks at describing language and language skills; module two covers lesson planning and selecting resources; and module three explores classroom practice. The course reflects the TKT syllabus and prepares you for the exam. There are mock exams on each aspect of the TKT exam as well as references and resources to allow you to continue your development after the course.

TKT KAL

The course lasts 12 weeks and consists of 12 units. Participants are expected to study and participate in online tasks for up to five hours per week. You will focus on developing your knowledge of the language systems needed by the teacher for planning and teaching their lessons. You will also focus on the teacher's awareness of the language needs of learners, and the difficulties involved in learning a second language. The exam areas of lexis, phonology, grammar and discourse will be covered during the course. There are mock exams on each aspect of the TKT KAL exam as well as references and resources to allow you to continue your development after the course.

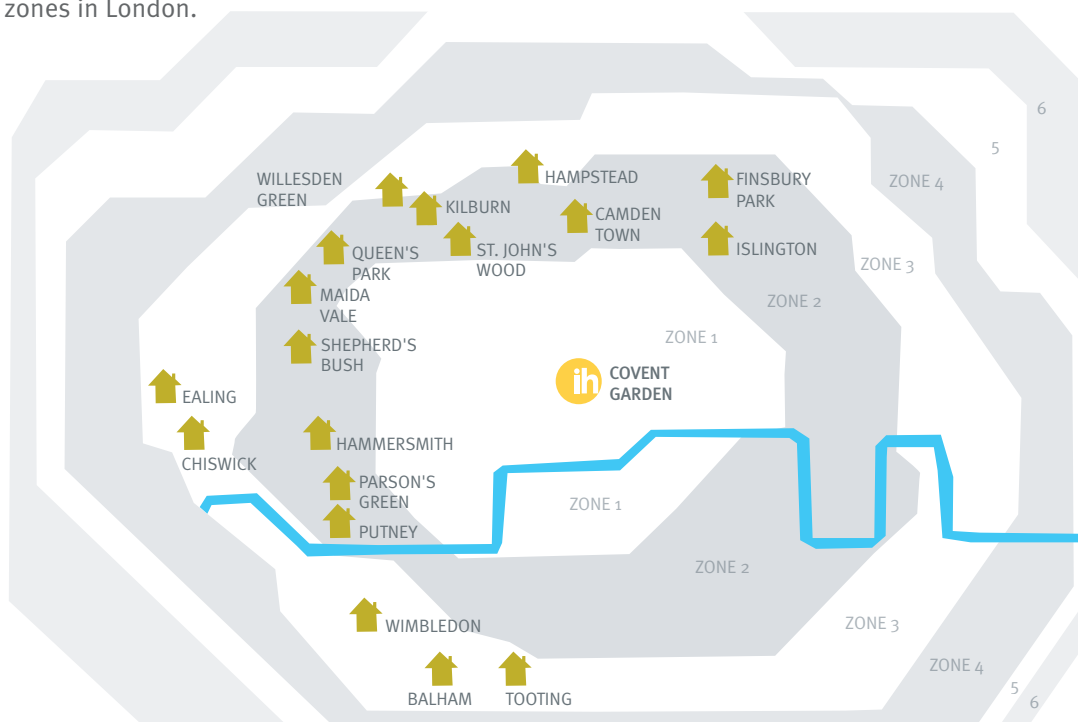

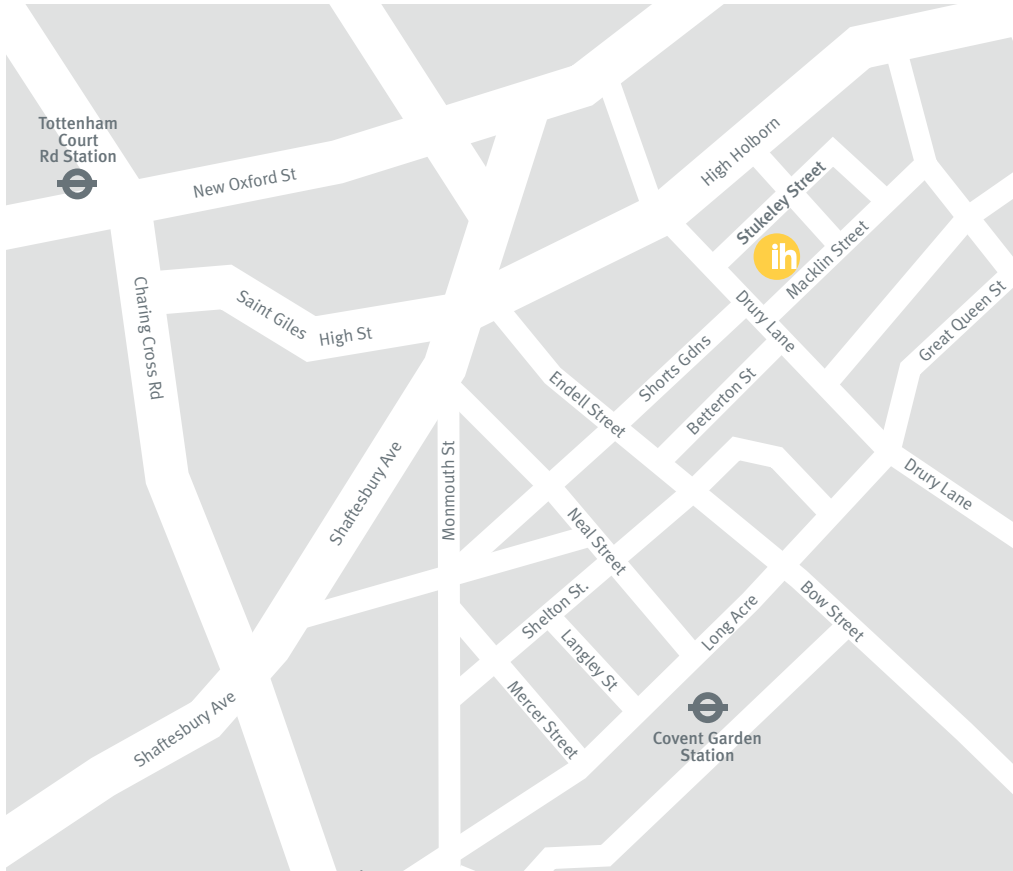
