Who should take this course?

This is an introductory course for people with little or no previous English language teaching experience, or little previous training. Whether you're a recent graduate or looking for a career change, the course will give you the skills and confidence to teach English to adults.

The Cambridge ESOL CELTA (Certificate in English Language Teaching to Adults) is highly regarded throughout the world and has been accredited by the Qualifications and Curriculum Authority (QCA) at level 4 on the National Qualifications Framework.



What does the course involve?

CELTA is available as a four-week full-time course, or 12-week part-time course. It will help you understand the principles of effective teaching, while acquiring practical teaching skills. The course includes:

- Daily teaching practice in groups of five
- Practical experience teaching students at different language levels
- Detailed feedback and discussion sessions with tutors
- Observation of qualified teachers
- Guided observation of filmed lessons
- Seminars and demonstrations to improve your language awareness
- Classroom management and lesson planning

There is no final exam: assessment is based on teaching practice and written assignments. You need to pass both elements to be awarded the CELTA certificate.

What are the course benefits?

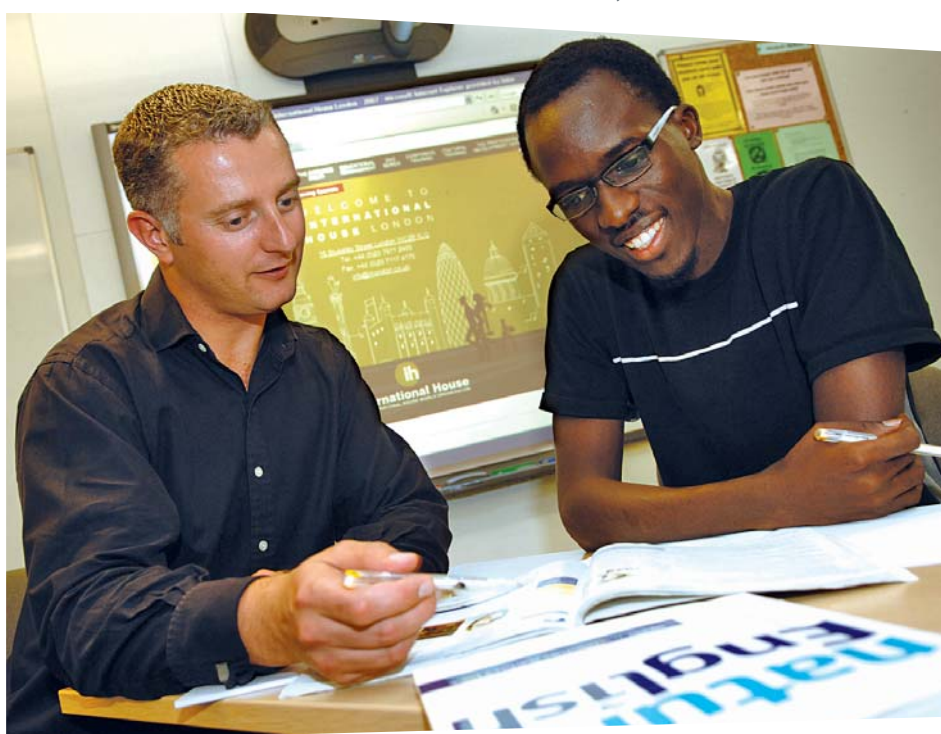
You will:

- Become much more language-aware and be able to apply this knowledge when teaching
- Start to understand how and why adults learn English, and what the role of the teacher and learner is
- Understand the principles and practice of effective teaching
- Develop basic skills for classroom teaching
- Understand which resources to use with adult learners, for teaching, testing and reference purposes
- Be able to identify development opportunities as professionals in the field

Entry requirements

- You should be 20 or over, although we will accept candidates aged 18-19 at our discretion
- Your education standard should be equivalent to that required for entry into higher education
- You must have an awareness and a competence in the language, both written and spoken, sufficient to undertake the course and to prepare for teaching a range of levels
- You must have the potential to become an effective teacher, and to complete assignments and assessments

Acceptance on to the course is conditional upon completion of an application form (which includes a Language Awareness Task) and a satisfactory interview.



Who are these courses for

- The **IH Certificate** is for non-native English speakers who would like to teach English as a foreign language. (You must be competent in English to Cambridge Advanced (CAE) level or C1 of the Common European Framework)
- The **IH CLTA** is for people who are native speakers (or native-speaker standard) in the language they want to teach: French, German, Italian or Spanish
- Both courses are initial teaching qualifications : perfect if you have little or no previous teaching experience

What does the course involve?

Both the IH Certificate and the IH CLTA can be studied full-time or part-time. You will learn practical skills to plan and deliver engaging and dynamic lessons. Course features include:

- Regular, small group teaching practice
- Practical experience teaching students at different language levels
- Detailed feedback and discussion sessions with course tutors
- Observation of qualified teachers
- Guided observation of videoed lessons
- Seminars and demonstrations to improve language awareness
- Classroom management and lesson planning

You will be assessed throughout the course with no final examination. Assessment is based on teaching practice and written assignments, and certificates are awarded to candidates who complete the course.

What are the course benefits?

- Understand the principles and practice of effective teaching to adult learners

- You must have the potential to develop the necessary skills to become effective teachers at a range of levels and to successfully complete assignments and assessments

Acceptance on to the course is conditional upon completion of an application form which includes a Language Awareness task and a satisfactory interview.



Our full time Cambridge Delta is accredited by the Qualifications and Curriculum Authority (QCA) at level 7 on the new National Qualifications Framework.

The Delta qualification is a balance of theory and practice to enhance your understanding of the English Language, while examining in-depth the principles of effective teaching and the practical skills required for teaching English. The course comprises three modules detailed below.

Who should take this course?

Delta is for experienced English language teachers who would like to improve their existing skills and develop new techniques for career progression. The qualification is a fast-track to professional recognition and can open up opportunities in teacher training, school management and ELT publishing.



Flexibility to take individual modules

Because the Delta is modular, you can also take individual modules as stand-alone courses. Each module is separately certificated by Cambridge and can be taken in any order. For example, if you already have a Delta qualification but want additional specialist certification then apply for Module 3. Or, if you have a Masters in ELT/ESOL/Applied Linguistics but want more practical experience then apply for Module 2. The table below will help you decide which module(s) is appropriate for you.

- For the 6-week Module 2 course, you should normally have already completed Delta Module One

Who should take this course?

General English teachers and people from the business world, ELT qualified, who wish to move into business English Teaching. Successfully completing the course will put you in a strong position for the ever-specialising ELT market.



What does the course involve?

This 2-week 50 hour course will help you acquire a good working knowledge and practical skills for the effective teaching of English for business.

There are 10 core modules:

- Definition of business English
- Concepts and language in a business context
- Needs analysis and research
- Course and syllabus design
- Materials and resources
- Approaches and methods
- International English, 'English as a foreign language, cross-cultural awareness in business
- Teaching oral business communication skills: meetings, negotiations, telephoning and presentation

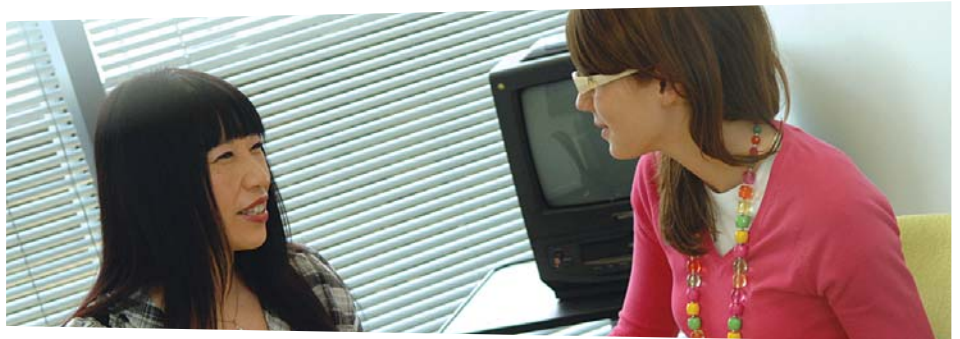

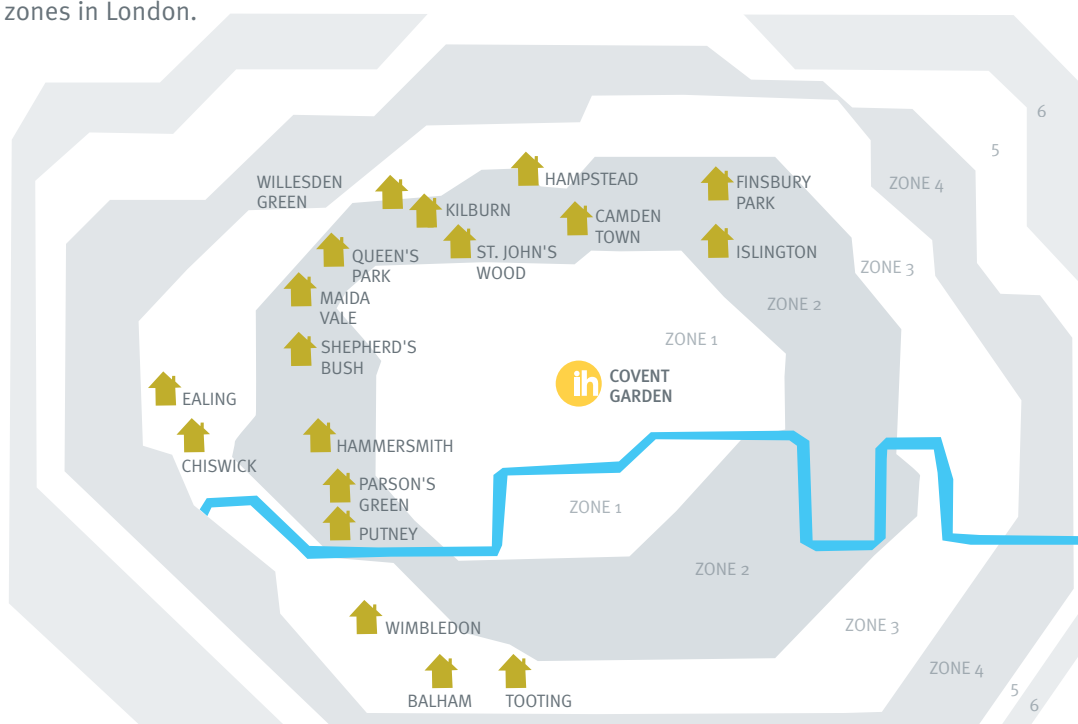

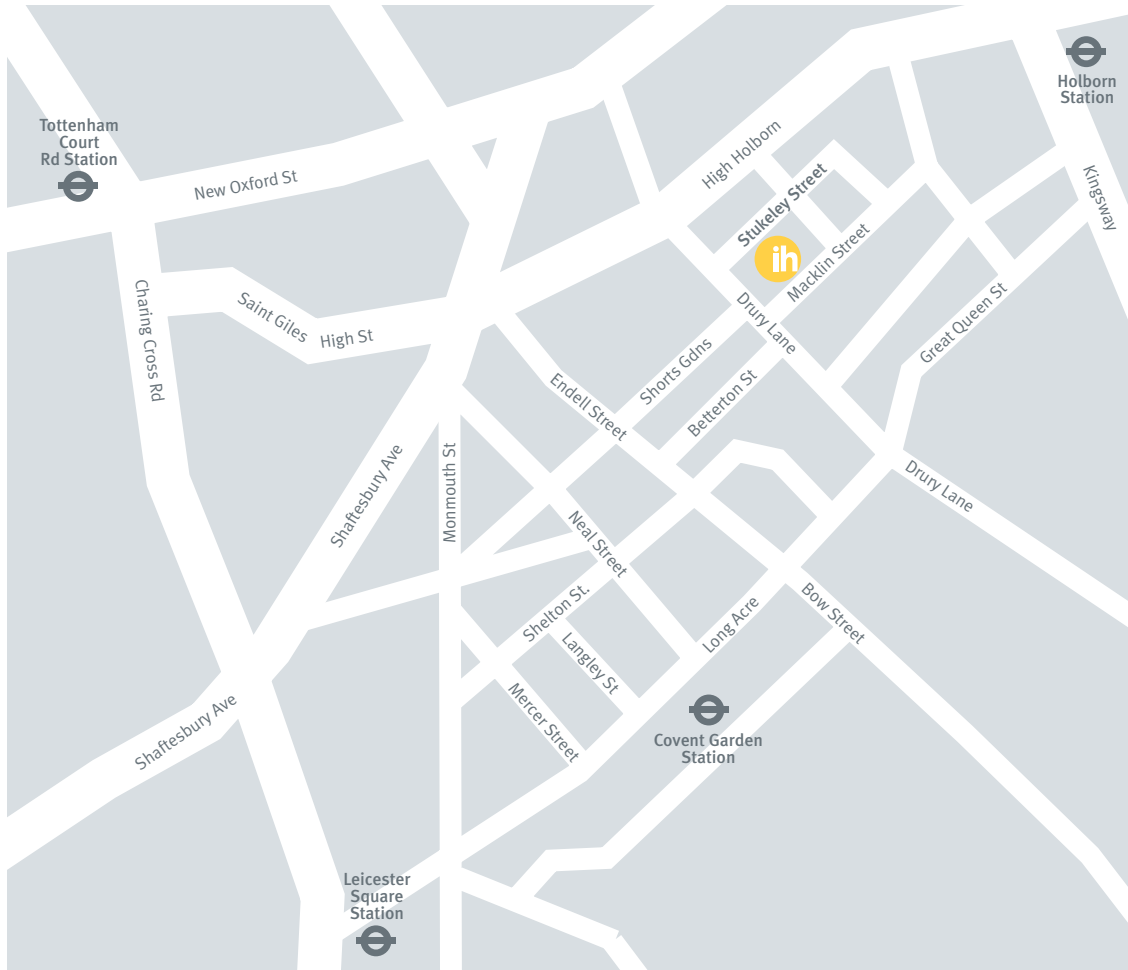
