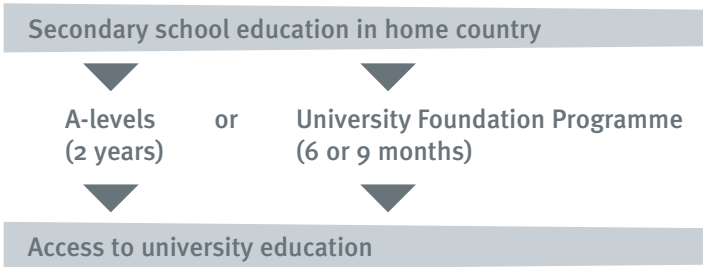

Because our UFP is flexible, you can choose to focus on **Law, Engineering or Business**. This will help you prepare for the specific undergraduate degree you wish to take.

Each option includes the compulsory **English Language module**, which will improve your communication skills and prepare you for academic study by working on the following:

- Reading Academic texts
- Listening & note-taking
- Research skills
- Essay writing
- Discussion and presentation skills
- Grammar and vocabulary
- Preparation for IELTS test, to help you reach an IELTS band score of 6.5

### Engineering Option

#### ADVANCED MATHEMATICS

This course will extend your mathematical knowledge and skills. It will help you progress to a physics or engineering degree at a UK university.

#### PHYSICS

This double module includes Newtonian mechanics, molecular physics and thermodynamics. It is excellent preparation for a physics course at a UK university.

### Business Option

#### BASIC MATHEMATICS WITH IT

A double module providing IT skills and a firm grounding in intermediate maths, which you will need for a UK business degree course.

#### ECONOMICS AND FINANCE

This module looks at macroeconomics and financial accounting, as well as teaching you how to use and analyse account statements. It is great preparation for overseas students who want to study business, finance or accounting at a UK university.

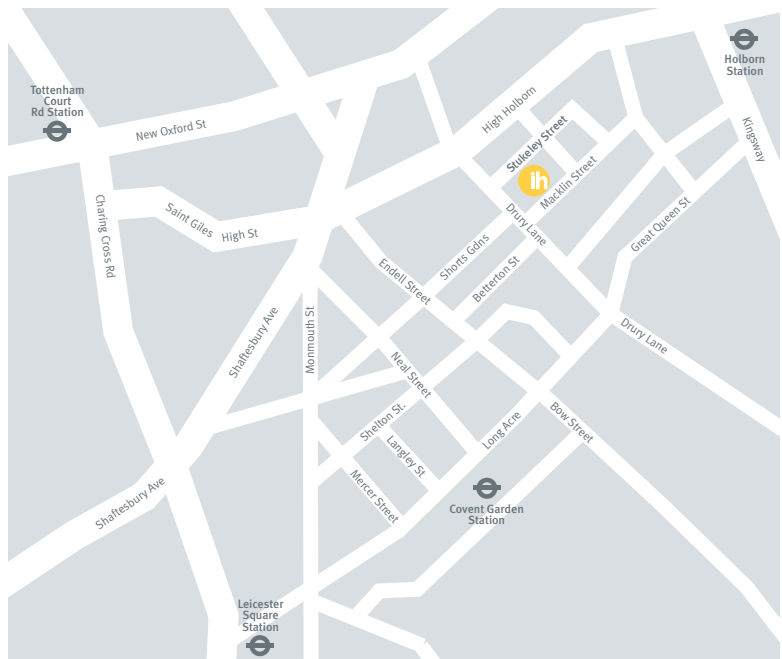
